Please be sure to make a duplicate copy of the documents for your own files.

Please note that scholarships are available to Twin Cities JACL members only. Scholarship applicants must be current JACL members or members of a family that has a current JACL membership at the Family level. To apply for a membership, please complete a membership application and send it along with your scholarship application form. A note about your essay: You are encouraged to contact family members or visit <a href="www.jacl.org">www.jacl.org</a> as you are doing research for your essay.

The Twin Cities Chapter of the JACL also invite you to be their guest at a dinner honoring all JACL 2019 high school graduates. The banquet is scheduled for <u>Thursday</u>, <u>May 9, 2019</u>. Presentation of scholarship awards will be made that evening. More details of the awards dinner will be sent to you at a later date.

<u>National JACL scholarships:</u> In addition to the local scholarships, National JACL scholarships for entering freshmen are also available. Decisions for awards will be made this summer. Applicants are judged on the basis of their scholastic achievement, extra-curricular activites, community involvement, personal statement and letter of recommendation.
