#### 1988 RIVERFRONT KITE FESTIVAL

Kites are an international phenomenon. They are one of the arenas where technology—graphite spars, ripstop nylon, new aerodynamic designs — has been most imaginatively applied. Kites are also the most simple of instruments, and can be made from a shopping bag or newspaper page and festooned with rags or ribbons. In short, kite flying these days is an activity in which everyone can participate, and in which all delight.

The Annual Riverfront Kite Festival is sponsored by the St. Paul Pioneer Press Dispatch, the Minnesota Kite Society, and the Saint Paul Riverfront Commission. It takes place at Harriet Island each year. The purpose is to draw attention to Saint Paul's riverfront in a dynamic and colorful way and to showcase the variety of kites today.
